# Sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ

Lesson 6 – Are You Equipped

Part 1: What is “The Gospel” and How Do You Share It?

1. If you took a random person off the street and asked him or her, “What does it mean to be a Christian?” what are some common answers you might get in response?
  
2. In order to share the good news of Jesus with somebody, you need to be absolutely certain you understand it yourself. So, first, let’s think about what the good news is *not*:

vs.

“Sharing the Gospel by word *and* deed”

7. So what is the good news of Jesus? Acts 11:34-43 is a great example!

8. So when someone asks us, “What must I do to be saved?” What should our answer be?

**A. Repent!**

**B. Believe!**

*When people ask me “How can I actually become a Christian?” I usually say, “It takes two things, and a third.” The two things – repentance and faith – I have just laid out. There is another crucial aspect, however. Why not just say that there are actually three things, then? I would prefer to say “two and a third” because the third is not so much a third thing as it is the way you do the first two...*

*...Therefore, repentance and faith must be done both individually and communally. We do them when we personally approach God in prayer (as in the previous examples), and also when we publicly identify with Christ by becoming part of the church. ~ Tim Keller, *The Reason for God*, pp. 187-8.*
